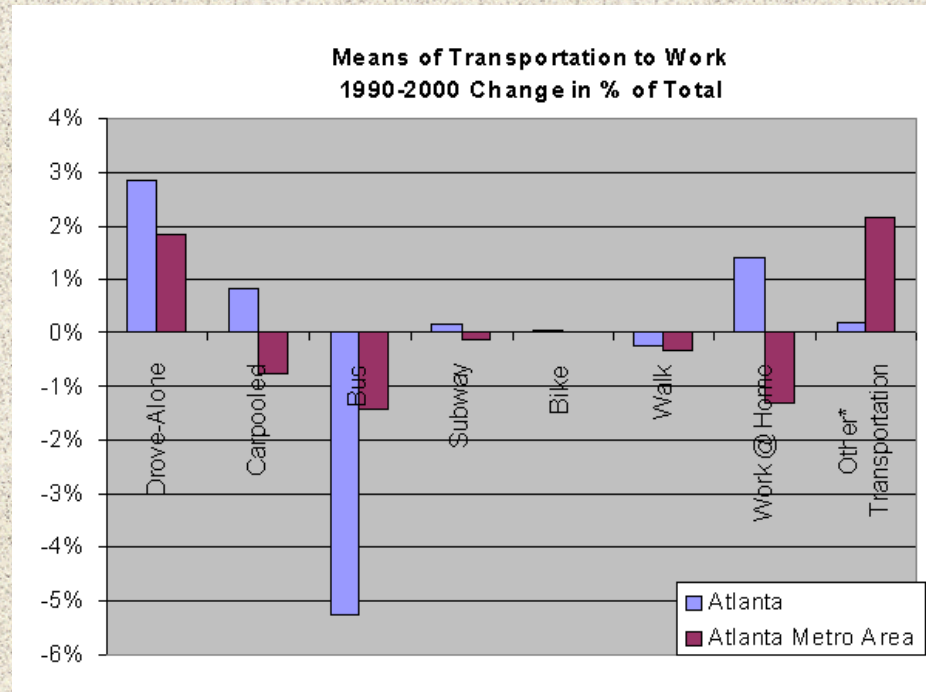

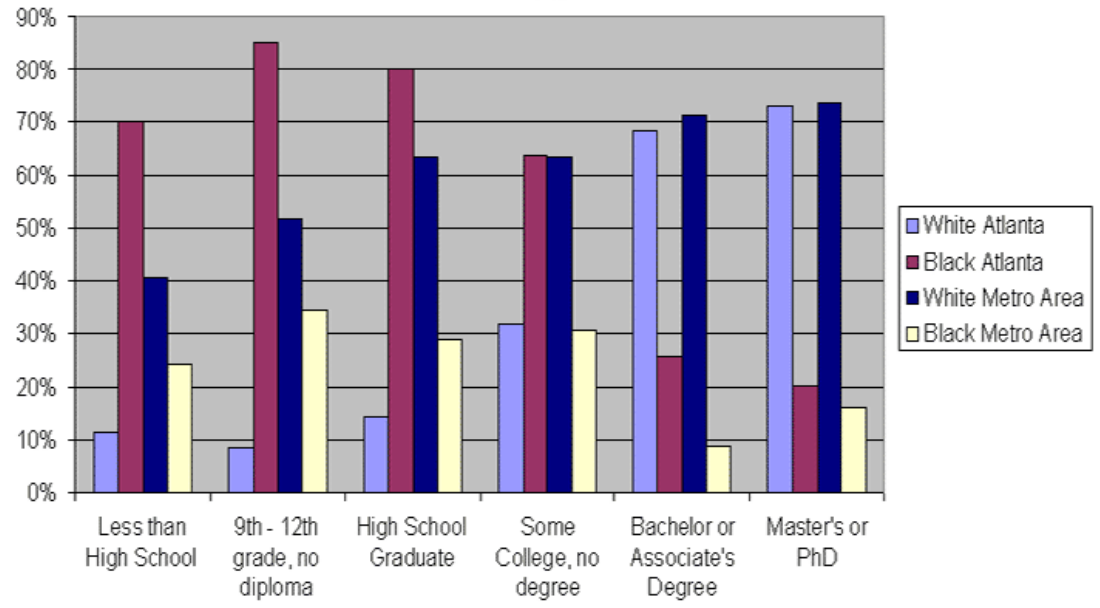

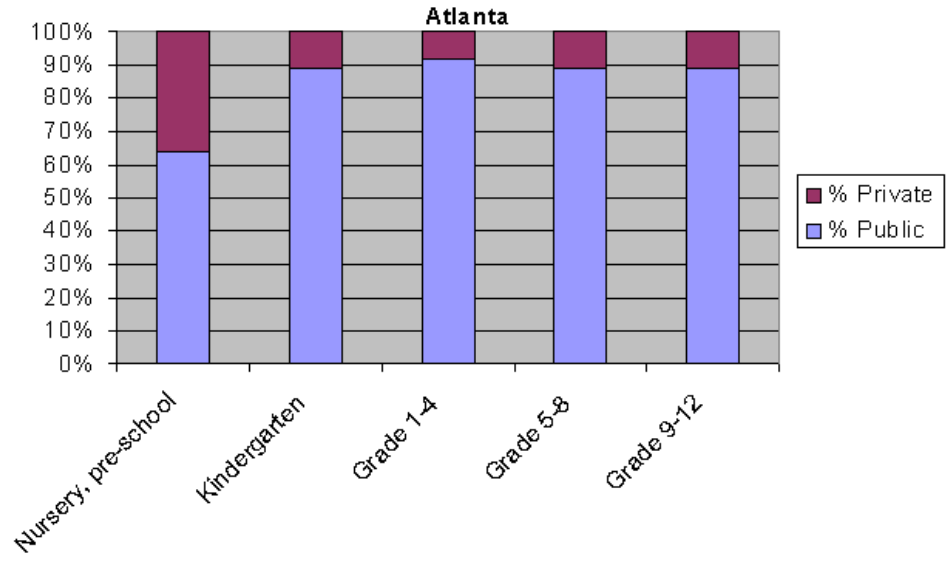

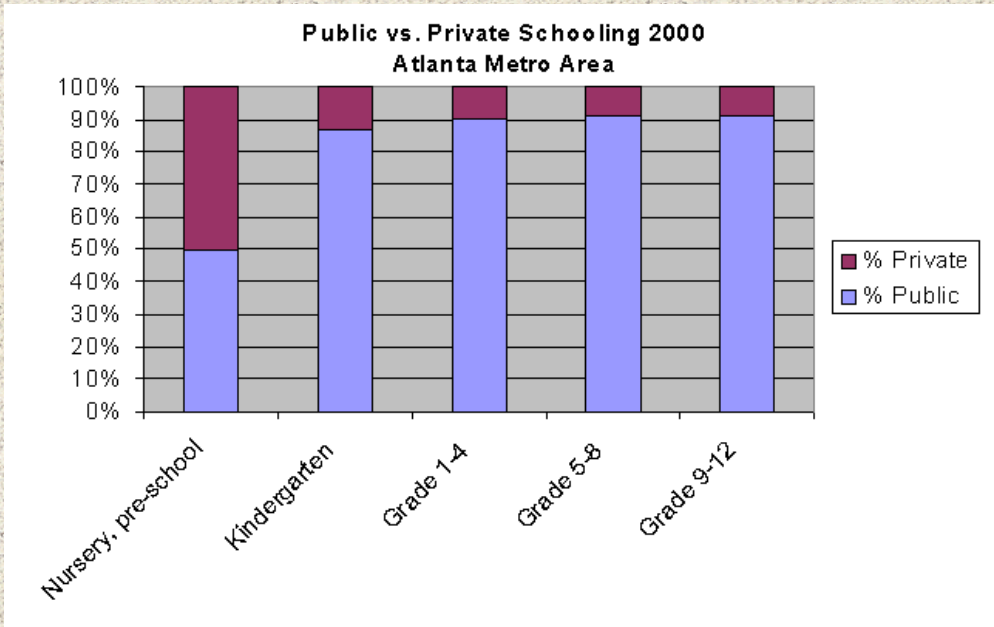

Public vs. Private Schooling 2000

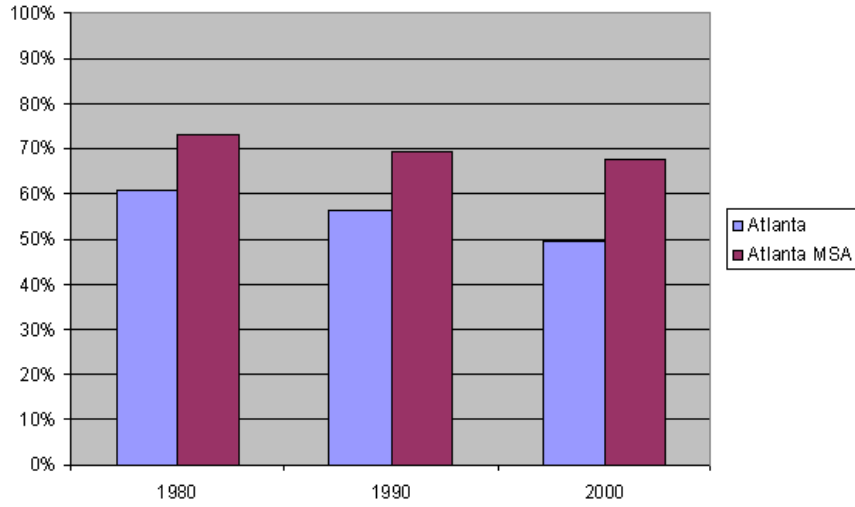

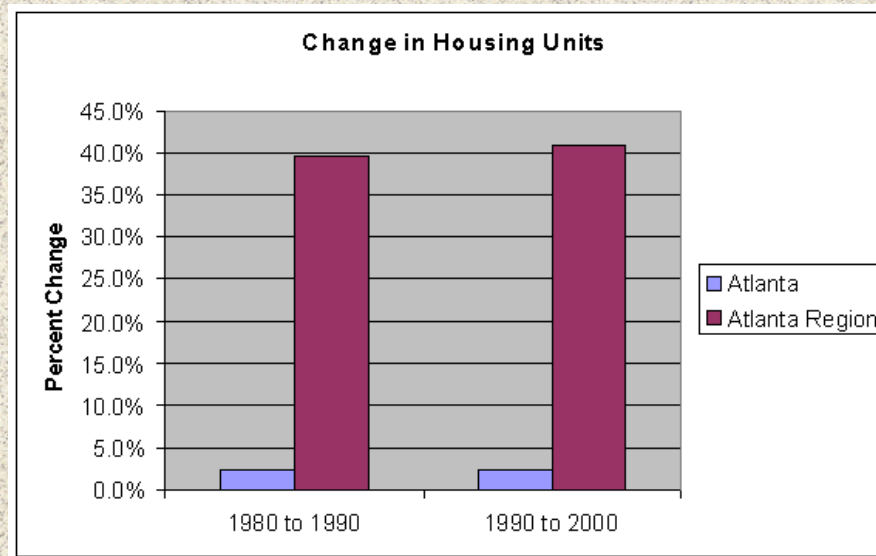

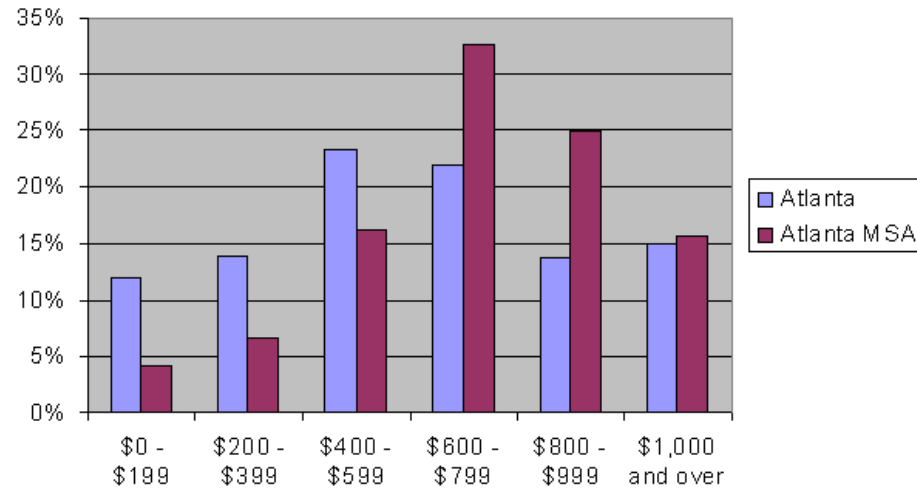

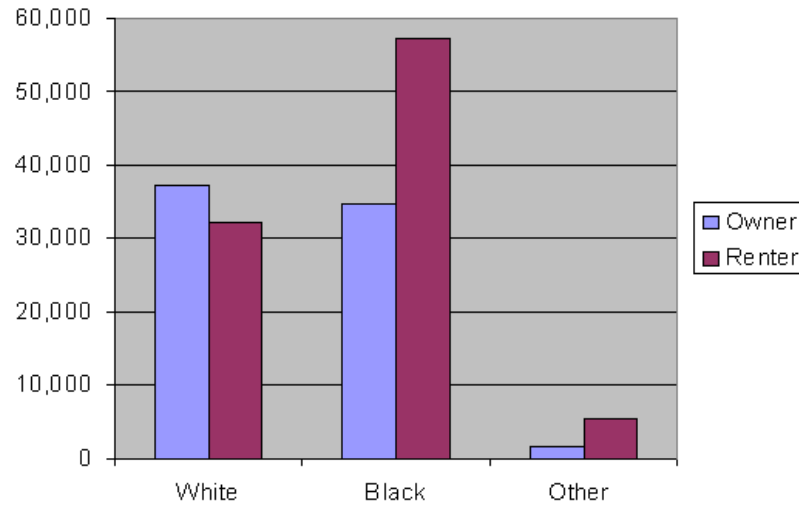

Distribution of Gross Rent 2000



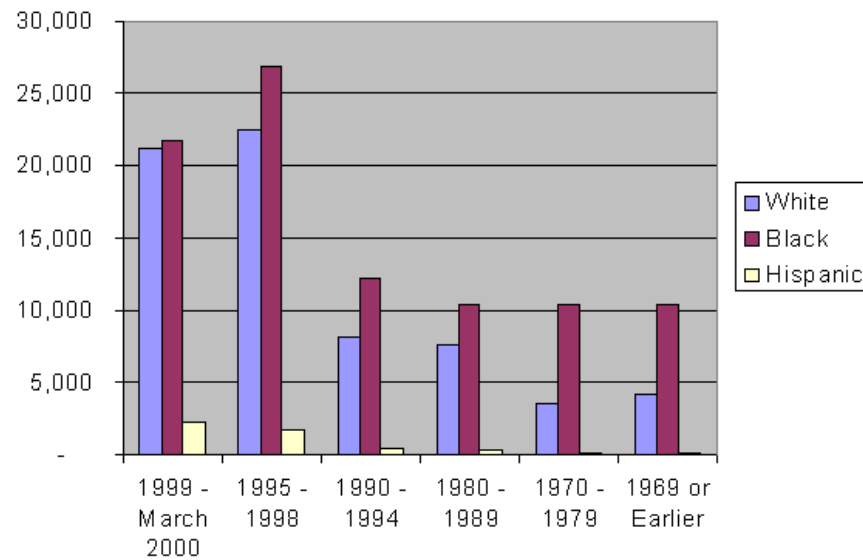

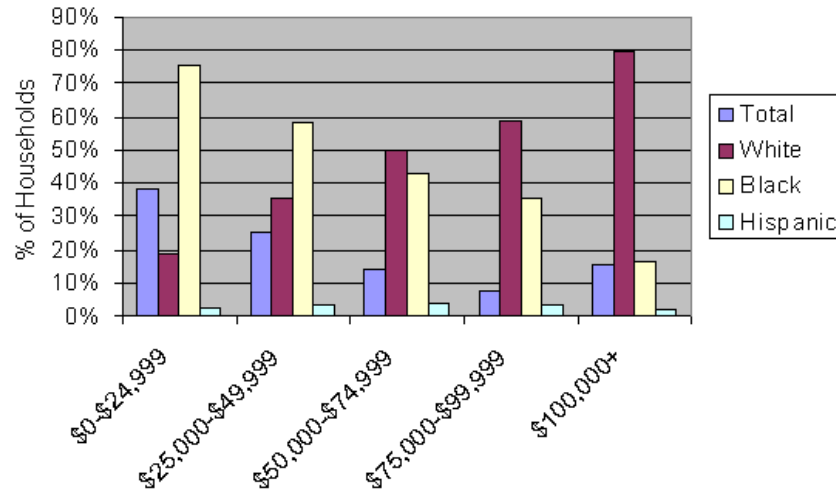

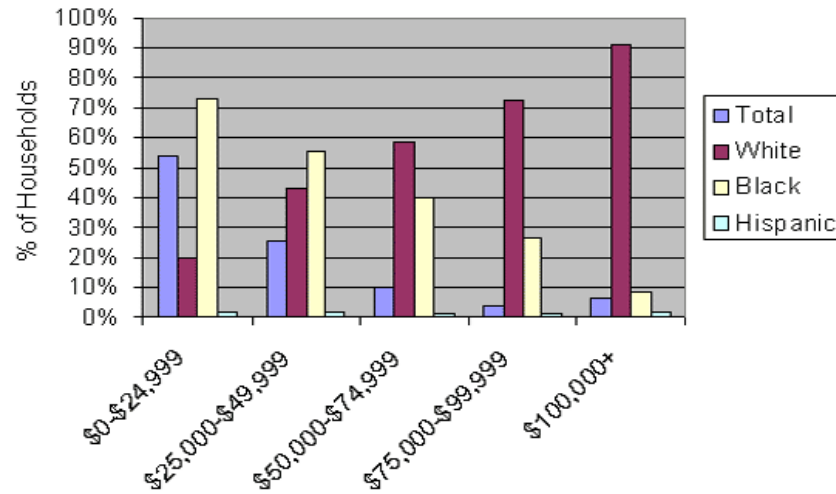

2000 Household Income by Race



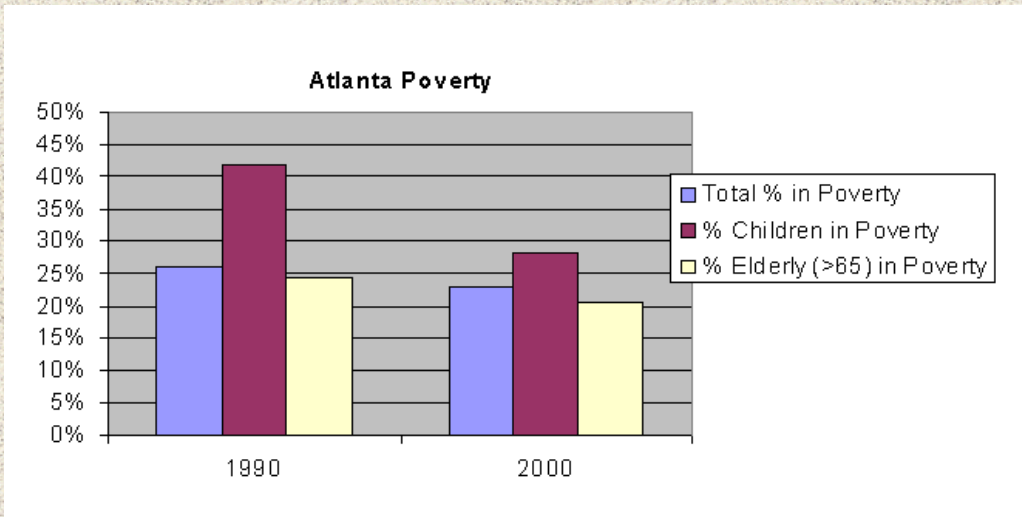
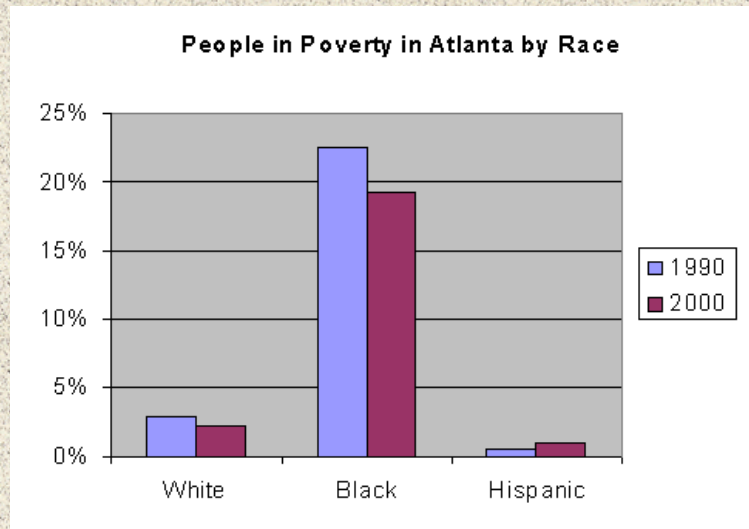
